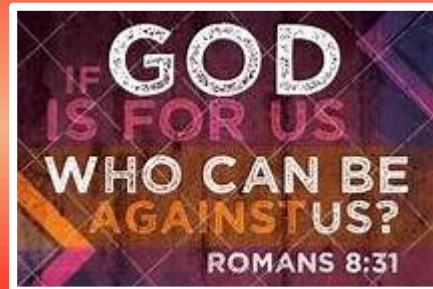

# Welcome

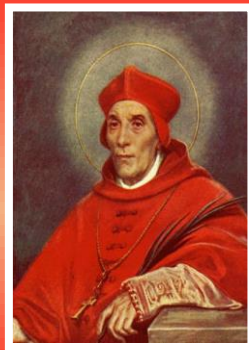
Today is the feast of St Thomas More, our Class Saint and the Patron Saint of our Parish. His faith was very important to him. St Thomas More had many gifts; he was good at speaking and listening, wrote history books and poetry and had a good sense of humour. He held the highest political and legal offices in the land; he served the King loyally and always spoke the truth.





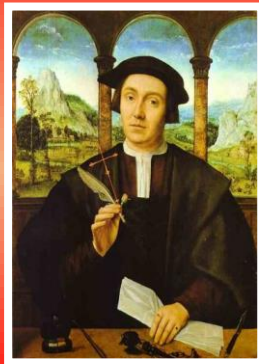
St Thomas More was born in Milk Street London on the 7<sup>th</sup> February 1445. His father was called John and his mother Agnes. When he was eight years old, he went to St Anthony's School, where he had fun and learnt Latin.

He became an altar server for Cardinal Morton. The boys waited at table and ran errands, but they still had time for their lessons.



While Thomas lived in the palace, he saw many beggars. He often gave away his food to them and throughout his life he would look after them. He became known all over the country as their best friend. Thomas lived Catholic Social Teaching, particularly the Option for the Poor and Vulnerable.

Thomas went to Oxford University and became a lawyer. While he was in university, he was often cold and hungry.



Thomas thought about becoming a priest, but married Jane and they had four children, three girls and a boy. Sadly, his wife died. Later, Thomas married again.

When his children were young Thomas and his family lived in the city of London. As he grew richer, and the family larger as he moved to a new home, on the river by Chelsea, All the family read books and wrote letters in Latin.



Thomas was a friend of King Henry. He was knighted and became Sir Thomas More. Henry the VIII would often visit Thomas' home where they would discuss Greek, theology, or astronomy. The King respected Sir Thomas's wisdom and made him Lord Chancellor in 1529.
