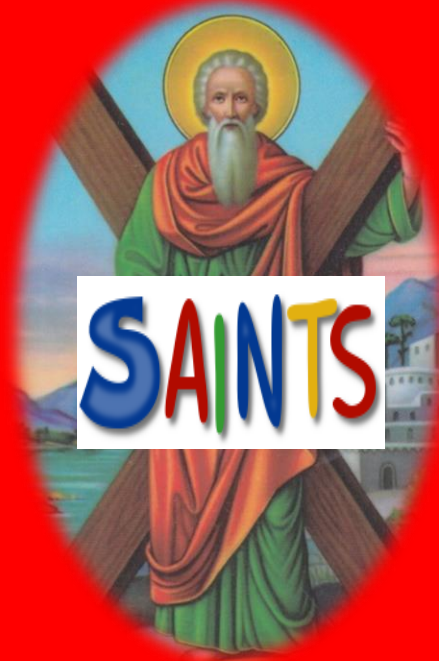

but in **darkness**

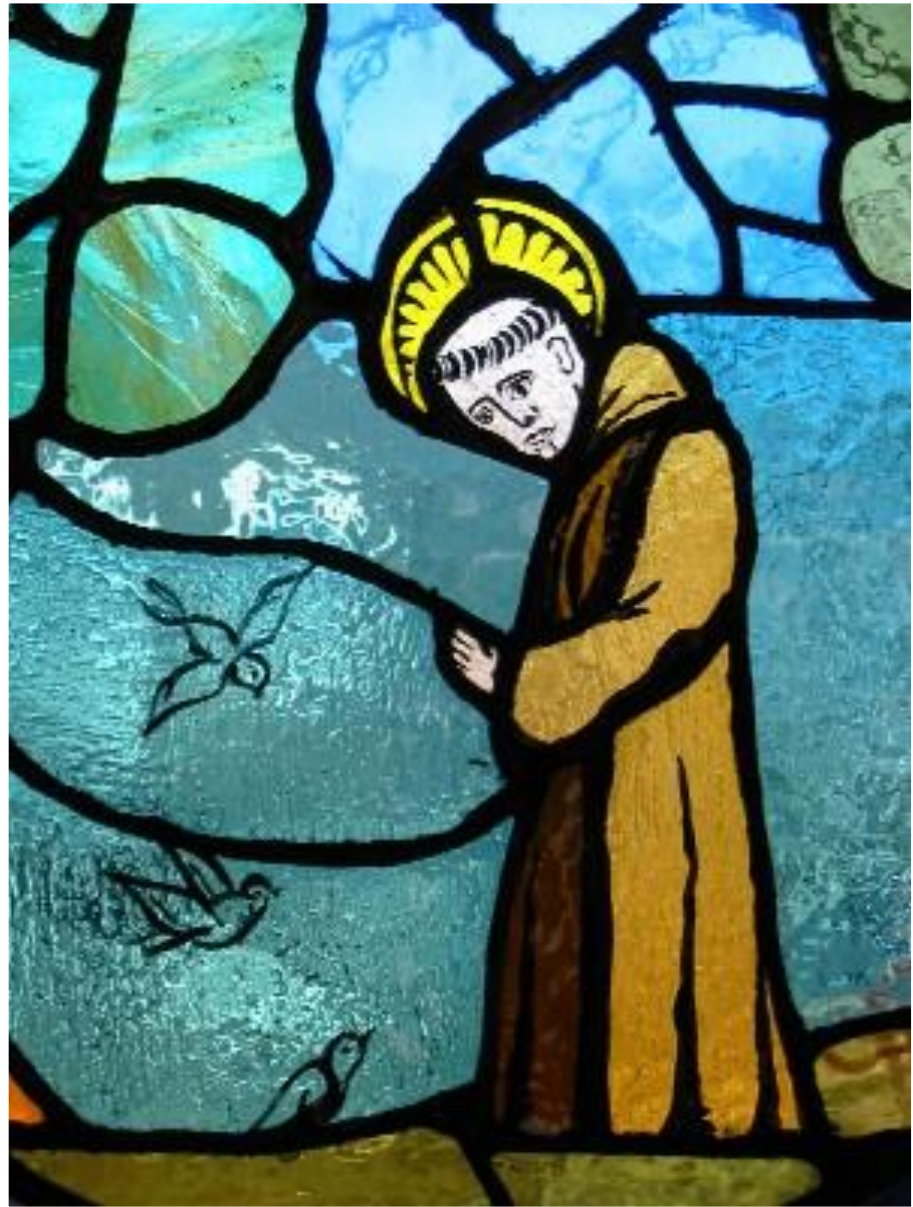
Their true beauty is revealed

SAINTS NAME

Why do we take a Saint's name when we are confirmed?

The Church gives us the Saints as Role Models.

The Saints have been identified by the Church as people who bore witness to God and put themselves at the service of others.

Some Saints have spread the Christian Message around the world and have written books telling of their faith.

Others have spent their lives looking after the needy.

Many have suffered torture and death rather than deny their faith.

NEW SAINTS

How does the Church choose new Saints?

The local Bishop looks at a holy person's life after they have died. They collect evidence, their letters and information from others and send it to Rome. After investigation they can be called Venerable. If one person has been cured through the intercession to the holy person, a miracle, then they will be called Blessed. After the second miracle then the person can be called a Saint. A second miracle attributed to Carlos Actuis has just been recognised by the Church and he will be canonised next year.

INSTRUCTIONS

Instructions for making your Saint's Stained-Glass Window

You will need two pieces of black card and a picture of your Saint. Cut out your Saint and place your Saint in the middle of the black card, not too close to the edges. Draw round the outline of your Saint.

Next draw a thicker line round your Saint.

Draw a border round the edge of your card.

Draw your panels carefully from the Saint to the border.

Not too small or too big.

Cut out all the panels where the stained glass will go.

You may wish to use the face and hands from the photocopy of your Saint.

Then trace the outline onto a second piece of black card and cut out another outline.

Take the transparent paper and cut out the shapes for the windows and glue them into the spaces.

Stick the second outline on the back of the first one.

It is important that you line them up exactly.

You may wish to write the name of your Saint on the black card using a gold or silver pen and add a few gems.

Your Saint is finished and will look great when it is displayed on a window.
