

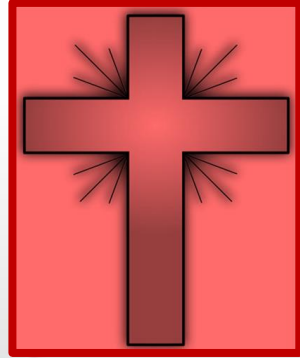

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

we remember them.




In the rustling of the leaves and in the beauty of Autumn

Eternal rest give unto them, O Lord,

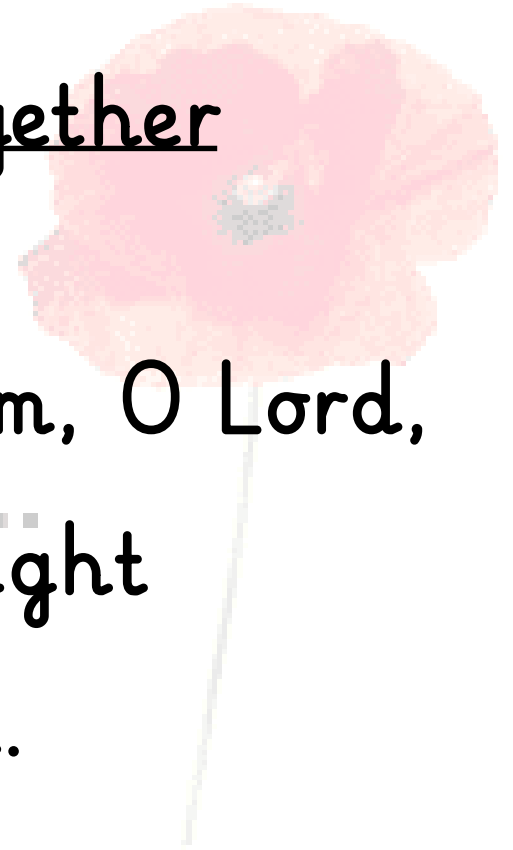
